We... Celebrate our Diversity


There are 38 different languages spoken by Stockbridge Primary children and their families! This year's BookFest celebrated our cultural diversity by encouraging children to read a book in the language they speak at home, and to bring in notes about their languages and the books they had read to share in class.

We also celebrated books set in different countries, and written in languages other than English, in school. In P5B, a Pupil Support Assistant read a story in Italian while the children looked at the bilingual text. They even learnt some Italian words!



We... Explore the World

BookFest 2022 encouraged children to read outside their own experience by picking up a book set in a country other than Scotland. Our international challenge asked

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We... Meet Authors and Illustrators BookFest 2022 was bursting with visits from some of our favourite authors and illustrators. Although the remaining pandemic restrictions meant we couldn't invite them into school in person, virtual visits enabled us to connect with authors and illustrators from across the UK: from Dundee to Brighton, London to the West Midlands, and from right here in Edinburgh.

These amazing professionals were so generous with their time, making our children laugh, inspiring them in their own work, opening their eyes to big questions, and sharing their expertise. Award-winning author and BookFest favourite Chae Strathie delighted our P1, P2/1 and P2 classes with a riotous event about his picture book *Gorilla Loves Vanilla*. Full of silliness, songs, dancing, stories and a naughty monkey, this event showed that reading is so much fun!

Children in P3, P4/3 and P4 polished their detective skills in a 'Mysterious Mysteries' workshop with Serena Patel, author of the *Anisha*, *Accidental Detective* series. From red herrings to suspects and clues, Serena shared her mysterywriting secrets then encouraged us to create our own detective stories.

Jonathan Meres had our P5 and P6 children in stitches as he joined us to talk about his awardwinning, million-selling *The World of Norm* series. Jonathan shared insights into his writing, showed off his guitar skills and answered our questions. There was even a cameo from his adorable dog, Pablo!

She answered all our questions in an engaging, powerful and thought-provoking event which sparked some great conversations!

P7 loved their brilliant workshop with illustrator Onyinye Iwu, whose artwork some of the children had previously studied. Onyinye explained how to work with pattern, shared a fascinating insight into how she works digitally, and encouraged the children to create their own designs.

Comic-book artist and illustrator Tanya Roberts has created work for Disney, Dreamworks and Netflix, so we were thrilled to welcome her to P7! This event was particularly special as pandemic restrictions were lifted at the last minute, meaning that Tanya could visit us in person. She shared her portfolio and led a draw-along, demonstrating how she creates characters. Then the children designed and drew their own comic-book creations.

BookFest's 'Crazy About Comics' activity invited children to create their own comic panel or strip to recommend a favourite comic, graphic novel or highly illustrated book. Series such as Dogman, Diary of A Wimpy Kid and The 13 Storey Treehouse are



perennial favourites, as are comics like *The Phoenix* and the *Beano*. Seeing the work of Stockbridge's budding comic creators makes us think that one day their own books will be featured on this list!

We... Bring BookFest Home

BookFest's hand-picked resources to explore and enjoy at home were completely refreshed for 2022. This time the collection of brilliant activities included everything from free audiobooks to quizzes, crafts and den-building, with plenty of listening, watching, making and doing to make sure that every child could find their own way into a wealth of stories.

Children could draw along with fantastic illustrators like Dapo Adeola, develop their comic skills with *The Phoenix*, visit the world of Tom Gates, watch million-selling author Anthony Horowitz talk about his Alex Rider series, or hone their writing craft with top authors like Sharna Jackson.


Mile We… Celebrate World Book Day





The Bigger Picture Stockbridge Primary School's annual BookFest, coinciding with World Book Day each March, is packed with diverse and innovative ways to celebrate reading – whatever the circumstances.



After two years of the covid pandemic, and against a distressing global backdrop, our children needed brightness in dark times. BookFest once again added excitement and sparkle, lifting spirits and celebrating our international community at a time when the news was full of the destruction of European bonds. BookFest encouraged children to share experiences, to understand more about other countries and other children's heritage, and to revel in our school's diversity as a source of strength.

BookFest 2022 was, by necessity, a hybrid festival. While pandemic restrictions were frustrating, we seized the chance to turn these limitations into opportunities. BookFest reached out to authors and illustrators across the UK, expanding our reach geographically from London to Dundee, Brighton to Walsall. Virtual events enabled connections we could never hope to make in person. And as BookFest drew to a close came a glimmer of hope for the future, as we were able to invite our first guests to the school in person.

This year's BookFest was underpinned by our longstanding aim of ensuring that every child can see themselves in a book. We drew upon the school's theme for the year of Diversity and Inclusion, with events championing neurodiversity and dyslexia, celebrations of our multitude of languages and cultures, and, as always, a focus not just on the written word but on telling stories through illustrations and comics. We're committed to making sure not only that every child recognises themselves in book characters and in book illustrations, but also that they can see themselves in the authors and illustrators we bring to BookFest. This determination is not just for BookFest 2022, but will continue year-on-year.
