Maisie Chan

We were thrilled to kickstart Bookfest 2023 with an in-person visit for our Primary 3 to Primary 6 classes with award-winning author Maisie Chan. It was wonderful to be able to bring Maisie to the school in-person, to mingle with the children, draw, laugh, explore and

have fun together!

Maisie is the author of the brilliant *Danny Chung Does Not Do Maths*, which won the Jhalak Children's and YA
Prize, the Branford Boase Award and was shortlisted for
the *Blue Peter* Book Awards. Her latest novel is *Keep Dancing, Lizzie Chu*, while she also contributes stories to
anthologies like *The Very Merry Murder Club* and writes
the exciting *Tiger Warrior* series.

Maisie began by explaining how she had always wanted to be a writer – but had also wanted to be lots of other things as well!



She told us some of the jobs she'd had before she became a writer, and where she got the ideas for her book *Danny*



Chung Does Not Do Maths. She explained that she drew on her own friends and family for inspiration, introduced the character of Danny, and read a little extract from the book.

She explained that when she was little, she didn't think she could ever be a writer because she didn't see any authors who looked like her, or meet any British Chinese characters in the stories she read.

Maisie talked about the importance of representation in children's books. She talked about how much it means to her to be a British Chinese author, and how she had wanted to write stories which included British Chinese children.

Danny Chung loves making comics. Maisie then shared Danny's formula for coming up with brilliant comic characters: to combine two animals, or an animal plus an object.

"I liked the idea of drawing half-something, halfsomething else." P5/6



Maisie set Stockbridge kids a challenge to make hybrid comic creatures of their own.



The school hall was a busy, chattering hive of activity as everyone settled down to draw their own imaginative comic creations. Children shared jokes and ideas, explained their drawings to their friends, showed off their work and collaborated. It really embodied our BookFest 2023 theme of 'togetherness'!

Maisie was so supportive, listening to everyone's brilliant ideas and offering comments, suggestions and so much encouragement as she walked around and talked to us about our work.

Finally Maisie talked about her

latest book, *Keep Dancing, Lizzie Chu*. She said if we like *Strictly Come Dancing*, road trips, Chinese mythology and deities, Marvel movies or *Star Wars* then we would like this book!



The event finished with a great Q&A in which the children were able to talk to Maisie and ask lots of excellent questions, from what her favourite book that she's written is, to what her next book will be about. Someone even asked, on a scale of 1 to 10, how much Maisie enjoys writing. Her answer was a very *Strictly*esque "10!"
